

Pentecost

Pentecost (Feast of Weeks) This feast day took its name from the way it was determined and it did not need to be observed on a particular day in the calendar but it was counted seven weeks or fifty days after the Wave Sheaf day and that's the reason why it's called "feast of weeks" in the Old Testament and is known as "Pentecost" in the New Testament which is in the Greek language Fiftieth!

The instructions for this festival and how to count up to it is in Leviticus 23:15-16.

Just as the day of Pentecost symbolizes the first small harvest of God's church so the day of Pentecost pointed to the spring or first harvest of those who should obtain salvation through baptism and the receiving of God's holy spirit (See Acts 2:1-4) You can also see this in Joel 2:28-29 which is a partial fulfillment of it after the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, this fulfillment will be completed in the kingdom of God.
